EMBA member, Dianne Koch, "makes history" with NABC slogan/logo win.

The competition was close, but early in January a winner was chosen in the competition for a logo and slogan for the North American Bridge Championships (NABC) to be held in Boston from November 20-30, 2008. Dianne Koch, a relatively new EMBA member, submitted the winning slogan—MAKE HISTORY IN BOSTON—along with her original drawing of a logo that includes a turkey outfitted with a Pilgrim hat and sporting playing cards in the place of tail feathers.

Koch's entry was selected from a field of more than 75 submissions. The field was narrowed to about a dozen finalists by NABC 2008 committee co-chairs Kathy Benjamin and Frank Lombardo, who solicited feedback from District 25 officials before selecting the winning entry. "There were a number of excellent contenders," said Lombardo, who extends his personal thanks to everyone who took time to submit an entry. "The final decision was unanimous. We think it will serve as an excellent promotional tool for our tournament."

Dianne, who has been playing duplicate for about a year, works in the operating room at St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Brighton, Massachusetts. She is the sister of EMBA members Bob Gaudet and Bernice Dziejma, whom she credits for inspiring her to play duplicate bridge. Dianne will receive free plays for the NABC tournament for her winning submission.

A professional illustrator adapted Dianne's art work for use on promotional materials associated with the national tournament. (See the logo—sans color, alas—on the front page of this issue of *Quick Trick*.) The official tournament banner was showcased at the regional tournament in Cromwell, Connecticut. Banners will be seen throughout the region and across the country over the next eighteen months to help promote the Boston North American Bridge Championships.

<<<<< Shark's "Pointers" >>>>>

Successful financial investment advisors and solid bridge players have learned how to master the fine art of risk assessment. Fidelity's famous Magellan Fund manager, Peter Lynch, taught me this valuable lesson in the diagrammed deal. The occasion was a recent social duplicate bridge game that has hosted by Phyllis McDevitt of Brookline to honor her husband, Patrick, who had just achieved the rank of Grand Life Master (10,000 masterpoints and a first-place finish in a North American Championship). I was playing with my wife, Susan, and Peter was playing with Pat.

Here's the deal:

The bidding went as follows:

Holding 11 high card points, and hearing his partner open the bidding, Peter had no problem realizing the balance of power was on his side, and he quite properly doubled me after I stepped into the auction with what turned out to be an ill-advised 1NT overcall. Peter understandably led his partner's suit, which gained me an extra trick, and if I were to have some luck in the club suit, I could easily see my way to six or maybe more tricks. I won the diamond queen and played the 8 of clubs towards dummy, hoping that Peter might rise with the king if he had it; or, if not, then Patrick might hold a doubleton king, and I would be able to score four club tricks in addition to my two diamonds and would have good chances for a seventh trick in one of the majors. This was not to be, however. After winning the first club, Pat returned a diamond, which I ducked, and I won the third round to try ace and a club, throwing Pat in again as Peter pitched a heart. Pat cashed the thirteenth diamond, on which Peter and I pitched spades, and then Pat returned the spade queen, which I covered with the king, and Peter won with the ace. A heart was ducked to my queen, and this was the position at trick 10:

I tried to induce a defensive error by leading a spade towards dummy. But Peter calmly ducked the spade around to his partner's 10, and there was now no way for me to gain an extra trick. Down three doubled was worth 500 points for Peter and Pat and a cold zero for Sue and me—which proved to be especially costly, as this was only the first round of the six-table game, and Sue and I finished second overall, only one match-point behind! Unlucky to run into such great defense, it is true. But the truth is that overcalling 1NT is one of the game's riskiest bids, and I would have been well advised to have had a greater source of tricks for my bid.

Shark's Pointer for this occasion is: Be alert to dangerous situations, and think twice before entering the opponents' auctions. There may be even bigger sharks lurking out in those waters!

Your district reps, Mark Aquino and Bill Hunter, think you will be quite impressed with the low hotel rates that Helen has successfully negotiated for New England bridge in the upcoming years.
