Putting Johnny on The Spot

According to the District 25 website, www.nebridge.org, nominations are currently being solicited for the prestigious Larry Weiss Trophy that is given to players who have demonstrated bridge mastery plus outstanding personal behavior both at and away from the table. Those who have been awarded it over the years are a very special group. It isn't given every year. In fact, it has only been awarded 17 times since it was first awarded 30 years ago. EMBA players have won this award 7 times since its inception. Sadly only 3 of the EMBA winners are still with us - the most recent recipient, our current Vice President, Bill Hunter; the 2005 Von Zedwitz Life Masters' Pair champion, Stephen Gladyszak; and the very first recipient, Atty. John McDermott - the person who in 1981 set the bar high for exceptional "grace and skill at the bridge table".

John and his partner found a nice defense to set a vulnerable game contract that was made at the other table in a KO match.

John made the normal lead of the 10 of spades, and John's partner could see that declarer had to hold the A and J of spades, so unless his partner had started with 6 spades, the defense had that suit doubly stopped. Looking at the AQ10x of clubs over dummy's K, it was clear from his side of the table that a club would be best if partner ever got in. This is a common situation in which a defense is crystal clear from one side of the table, but not so clear from the other. John's partner false-carded in tempo with the K at trick one, hoping to send the message that there wasn't much future in that suit. Looking at the dummy's strong hearts and diamonds, the only suit that offered any hope would be the club suit, so clearly a

switch to clubs would be in order. John got the message loud and clear. He won the Ace of diamonds and after giving the matter quite a bit of thought, made the bold play of returning the Jack of Clubs – the only way to set the contract!

Today's Shark Pointers are:

- 1) Don't be afraid to tell a "white lie" to partner and false card if it will help get an important message across, and
- 2) Don't be afraid of giving away an overtrick when the lead of an honor might be the only way to set a hand.

Cape Cod Season Starts

The Nauset-Brewster Duplicate Bridge Club Thursday evening game will resume for the season on May 19, 2011.

The Provincetown Bridge Club will open for the season on Monday evening, May 2, 2011. Duplicate games will resume on Monday evening, June 6, 2011.

ACBL and World-Wide Games

International Fund Game #2 is scheduled for Wednesday afternoon, May 11, 2011. Hand records are provided by the ACBL. The sectionally-rated points awarded are half-black and half-red. No district or ACBL-wide overall points are awarded.

This year's World Wide Bridge Contest is scheduled for Friday evening, June 4, 2011 and Saturday afternoon, June 5.

There are several ACBL Inter-Club Championships scheduled for the second quarter. Check the Special Games listing for the participating clubs and times.

North American Pairs

June begins a 3-month period of NAP Qualifying Games. Players qualifying at the club level can participate in the District Final that will be held October 15-16 at the Sturbridge Host Hotel. The three flights are Open, 0-2000, and 0-500 Non-LM. The flight winners each receive a subsidy of \$700 to compete at the Spring NABC+ in Memphis, TN from March 15-25, 2012. Second place finishers in each flight receive a subsidy of \$300. District 25 will provide a \$100 subsidy for third place finishers.
