BRACKETED TEAM SURVEY REPORT

There were sixty teams in play in the experimental bracketed game in December. Of the seventy percent of the players responding to the survey 108 liked the format and 54 did not. Players in the open game (12 teams) were overwhelmingly in favor of the format. Teams reflecting total masterpoints between 800 and 2000 showed a preference for the regular Swiss format. A major concern, teams wishing to "play up," is being addressed by the Tournament Committee. This bracketing format is being scheduled again for the August sectional in Watertown.

Can You Hear the Quiet?

I was playing in a small tournament and picked up ♠AJ432 ♥J4 ♦AQ84 ♣Q7. My LHO's bid of one club was passed around to me, and I balanced with one spade. Partner bid two clubs to show a limit raise, and I accepted with a four-spade bid.

The opening lead was a small club, and dummy came down as follows:

<i>Me</i>	<i>Dummy</i>
♠ AJ432	♠ K65
♥ J4	♥ Q1075
♦ AQ84	♦ J9532
♣ Q7	♣ A

I won the ace of clubs in the dummy and took a spade finesse, losing to the queen. A spade came back, and I finished drawing trumps with the ace and the king. I next led a diamond to my ace and dropped the singleton king in LHO's hand to make +420 (five diamond tricks, four trump tricks, and the ace of clubs). Do you see why I played as I did?

Simple. LHO did *not* lead a high heart honor either on opening lead or when she got in with the queen of spades. Therefore, RHO has either the ace or king of hearts. With this honor holding in hearts, if RHO also held the king of diamonds, he would have responded to his partner's one-club bid. So the king of diamonds has to be on my left. Sometimes you have to listen to the quiet.

Shark's "Pointers"

by Mark ("the Shark") Aquino

- 1) Review the hands after the session to see if you can discover errors that reveal opportunities you may have missed at the table.
- 2) Don't follow "rote" rules when defending a hand. Instead, examine every possibility for gaining an extra trick.


In the game of chess, one of the boldest stratagems is to deliberately sacrifice one's queen in order to gain a compensating advantage and eventually win the game. During the postmortem after a recent game at Westwood DBC, my partner Yiji Starr of Wayland, Massachusetts, pointed out how I might have been able to do the same thing at the bridge table. Since "queen's gambit" is peculiar to the game of chess, Yiji suggested that this coup might be called "Aquino's Gambit." Here's the full deal:

Following the maxim of "leading through strength," I led the king of spades into dummy's AQJ9852. Declarer pitched a diamond and made the peculiar play of running the trump six around to me, which I won by cleverly false-carding with the king. (Otherwise, there goes my story.) I shifted to a diamond, and partner obliged by playing king, ace, and another diamond, allowing me to score a ruff with the two of hearts. This was now the position:

In this position, I fell from grace by playing a club to my partner's ace, and the only other trick we scored was the heart queen. (I had considered playing a low trump to dummy's jack. But then declarer would win in dummy and cash a high spade while pitching a club, and I would have to ruff with the queen of trumps and be end-played in clubs.) Down three, doubled, +500, was worth most of the matchpoints, but look what happens if I sacrifice my queen! "Aquino's Gambit" forces declarer to win the trick in his hand, and it takes away dummy's trump so there can be no club ruff. Now when declarer plays a low club to his 10, partner will win the jack and play the last diamond, forcing declarer to ruff and once again lead away from the king of clubs for down four and +800 for the defenders!!

Special Games a Hit with New Players

If you have fewer than 50 masterpoints, don't miss out!

In January, EMBA introduced two new games to encourage new players to compete for master points and learn more about duplicate bridge in a friendly atmosphere. So far, both games have earned good reviews from players. "We've had nothing but positive feedback for the Fourth Wednesday games, hosted by the Bridge Spot in Woburn," says Ann Borgschulte, co-chair of EMBA's Newcomer Committee who has worked with Bridge Spot owner, Dean Panagopoulos, to make the games successful and inviting. Lectures have received great reviews. Recently, Bruce Greenspan, Joe Cappannelli, Anand Lele, Steve Groag and Chris Apitz have provided informal lectures. Other local experts are scheduled for games in the coming months.

The Second Friday games, hosted by the Westwood Duplicate Bridge Club, have also been well received. "Players expressed

an interest in talking about hands after the game," says Stuart Whittle, who co-chairs the EMBA Newcomers Committee, "and we have enjoyed lively discussions."

These special games were designed to help new players develop their bridge skills in a friendly environment.

Both games begin with an informal lesson on some aspect of duplicate bidding, play or defense. Experienced players are available to answer questions before, during and after each game.
