Bill Braucher and Rick Binder have long been recognized as one of the top pairs in New England duplicate bridge. On the diagrammed deal, Bill knew that bidding a grand slam was a gamble—but a reasonable one for an expert. His optimism was rewarded by his truly brilliant play of the hand. Take a look at the auction—and the deal—in the box on the right.

After Rick's six heart bid, Bill knew that his partner held five or more hearts to the Ace and King, the diamond Ace and no other Kings. Adding these top tricks to his club Ace and eight solid spades, he could count 12 tricks. However, Bill was optimistic that there would be an opportunity to set up a 13th trick—with an extra heart trick in dummy, the diamond Jack or heart Queen in Rick's hand or with a finesse or a squeeze. On that basis he bid the grand slam.

West made the passive lead of a trump, which had the benefit for the defense of removing an entry to the dummy. Braucher could no longer play for hearts to divide four-three; now something good had to happen. So Bill played out six trumps to put pressure on the defense. He then cashed the club Ace. With six cards remaining, the hands held the cards that you see in the bottom half of the box to the right.

Now, Bill played his second-to-last spade and East was under pressure. In fact, holding four hearts to the Jack and the King-4 of diamonds, there wasn't much he could do. He smoothly pitched a diamond on the spade. However, Bill read the position perfectly. He played a diamond to dummy's Ace, dropping East's

King, cashed the Ace and King of hearts, ruffed a heart with his last spade, and came back to his hand to cash the now-good Queen of diamonds, making all 13 tricks.

#### Is there a defense to beat the contract?

A heart lead sinks the grand slam because it removes a valuable entry at trick one and declarer cannot shake a loser no matter how well the hand is played. After a spade lead, the East defender is always squeezed and the best he can hope to do is to deceive declarer into getting the wrong picture of the hand. If East pitches a diamond at his first opportunity—before he pitches a heart—declarer might assume that East started with four hearts to the Jack and three diamonds to the King. Now, declarer may play the top two hearts and ruff a heart, planning to establish dummy's low heart for his thirteenth trick, keeping the diamond Ace as an entry. However, as the cards actually lie, that won't work.

Today's Shark's Pointers: There are multiple lessons in this fascinating hand. 1) Before you lead, try to visualize the distribution and high cards in your opponents' hands based on the bidding. That may not get you to the right lead—but it might. On this hand, you know that partner holds long hearts; and if partner holds any other important card, you may be able to anticipate the pressure. 2) When bidding, take a reasonable gamble for one more trick— if you feel confident that you can execute the advanced plays demonstrated in this deal—or even if you just want to practice them.
3) When declaring, play out winners to put pressure on the opponents. Ask yourself what distribution it would require to make the contract, and, if it is reasonable—play for it. Finally, 4) when defending against an expert, a little deceit on your distribution can go a long way. Follow these pointers consistently, and you will consistently win at bridge! ♣

#### CADDY FOR COMMUNITY SERVICE CREDIT

If you have a teenager who is looking to earn credit community service credit for an academic or religious program or for a scouting badge or some other organization, consider a volunteer job as a caddy at the Boston NABC during the eleven-day period from November 20 to 30, 2008. Caddies are paid for their work and can donate their pay to their affiliated organizations while earning community service hours. It's a great opportunity for friends or classmates to volunteer together.

Caddies must be at least 16 years old and should be willing to work for at least one full day. (Caddying for three+ days is even better). Training is provided—and the skills are easy to master. For more information on caddying, contact David Rock at Dave@microgrit.com.
