


CLUB NEWS




When the dummy hits and it looks like you are in trouble, don't give the show away by scowling at partner. This will only help alert your opponents to find winning defenses that they may not otherwise find. Try, instead, to think of a lie of the cards that could prove successful, and just proceed to play the hand as if that is precisely the way things are. By following proper technique and cashing your winners in the right order, you'll be amazed at how often seemingly hopeless contracts are actually cold! The hero of today's deal, Sarah Sykes of Brewster, MA, followed these principles to execute a rather spiffy squeeze!



When Sarah saw the dummy, her immediate reaction was –"Down 1". There looked to be no way to avoid the loss of 2 diamond tricks.

Sarah saw one hope: if she covered the \$10 with the \$J\$, East's remaining spades would be K empty, so he might be vulnerable to a throw-in. If she could come down to a three-card ending with a diamond and the \$AJ\$ in the dummy, East, probably through a defensive error, might come down to \$Kx\$ and the \$A\$, which would allow her to throw him in with the diamond and get the extra trick she so badly needed when he would need to lead away from his high spade. So she played along those lines. She covered the \$10\$ with the \$J\$, ruffing when East covered with the \$Q\$. Now, without hesitation, she unblocked the \$AKQ\$, and trumped the \$5\$ to return to her hand. She now played her last trump, pitching the \$4\$, and cashed the \$K-J-Q\$ to achieve the following ending:



North on play cashed the ♥A, and East started to squirm. He obviously couldn't pitch a spade, and he realized that if he discarded the ◆Q, declarer would have no problem in finding a diamond play to endplay him, so he tried his only remaining option and discarded the ◆A! Now Sarah continued with the ◆10 from dummy to East's Q and her 3. This created an impossible problem for West. If he let his partner win the ◆Q, East would be endplayed into giving the dummy the last 2 tricks with the ◆A J. So he tried overtaking partner's ◆Q with his ◆K. But now he had to lead away from the ◆97 into Sarah's ◆J8, scoring her slam in a way that she surely could not have envisioned in her wildest dreams!

Notice that it doesn't help East to discard both diamond honors. In fact, this line of play works whenever East holds two or three diamond honors! This fabulous, very rare end position was dubbed a "winkle" by the British author, Terence Reese in his book "Master Play."

Today's Shark's Pointers:

- When you are in trouble, don't let them see you sweat! Always exude confidence! This is a real key to winning bridge.
- Envision a possible end position or magic lie of the cards that will enable you to make the hand and play accordingly.
- Unblock as necessary, and time your sequence of plays so as to allow you to cash all your winners before making the critical play. Declarer's cashing her last trump before running her 4 hearts in dummy was key to her achieving this end position.
- It is worth the effort to learn proper technique from good bridge books such as Reese's. Even if you don't visualize the exact position on a complicated hand, knowing how to put maximum pressure on the opponents is important.
- Sometimes following proper technique results in amazing endings like "winkles"! When they do, please send them in to "Shark's Pointers"!
